Dear AAA MEMBERS, Greetings! I hope you are all faring on well. Thanks to God for your prayers and the support you are giving to Kenya. May God bless you. It is our prayer that, GOD will strengthen you, open more ways for you so that you can support the Lord's work and people. There are so many needs but we thank God for you and the efforts you have put in to see that by Gods grace at least our needs are met. Right now we have a serious drought in most areas of Kenya. People are affected with the drought, and some like Trukana, Lodwa, Mandera, Kajiado are most affected.

Currently about 290,000 cattle have died due to the drought. It is our hope God will open ways for these areas affected to get water and food. Other places in Kenya are also hit hard with the economy. A bag of maize used to be KSH 3000, but now it has gone higher by 100%. By now the cheapest bag of maize is KSH 6000. Many people who have low income are struggling with life at the moment. Widows, poor saints are in need of food that is scarce.

The weather is unpredictable. The harvests are very low simply because of the drought or sometimes there are long heavy rains that spoil crops leading to poor harvest. Let us continue in prayers. We value your prayers and support if God opens ways. There are many overwhelming needs in Africa and we hope that you will not get tired of doing good. Galatians 6:9-10. The Assemblies in Western Kenya are now 14 and 5 in Uganda. The Lord's work is increasing every year. In Western Kenya, there are two Bible centres and the third one is going to start from next year 2023. These are Busia, Bungoma, and the incoming one in Emunku Brethren Assembly Fellowship. The reason why the elders have decided to have three Bible centres, is because of the long distances to travel to Bible Training Schools. We would like to bring Bible Training Schools nearer to the Bible students. In Uganda, we still have one Bible Centre at Busitema. Recently, we just finished Bible Training Schools at Busia and Bungoma that started from 19/09/2022 up to 24/09/2022. If God wills, we shall be travelling to Uganda on 03/10/2022 for one week Bible seminar at Busitema. This is the time we shall also take financial support for the gospel and Uganda projects. Next visit to Uganda God willing, will be the last week of November 2022. Otherwise we distributed money to all workers who really appreciate your continual support for them. By now we are still in the process of dealing with projects and buying of chairs and mattresses for Bible Training Centres and other Assemblies. Ksh 150,000 have been dispatched to Khunyangu brethren Assembly to start construction of their Chapel, while Ksh 60,000 have gone to Lutungu Brethren Assembly to construct their Chapel.

God bless you more for supporting widows and orphans. Thanks for supporting me also in the Lord's ministry. I received all the money you send to me as my support in the Lord's ministry. May God bless and protect all those who are contributing towards my support in the Lord's work. I really thank God for them. I always pray for them and I will never forget how they have enabled me to serve the Lord. I thank God for the entire AAA Committee members for their total commitment in supporting the Lord's work in East and Central Africa.

PRAYER UPDATE from youth impact in KISUMU AND NYAHURURU Dear Ministry Partner,

As we reflect on the past month and think of how God has been faithful and good to us, we can truly say that He has been a great source of support to Youth Impact Kisumu and Nyahururu through you, as we've laboured to serve our teenagers in various schools. We're also so grateful to you for lifting us up in prayer regularly. Prayer is powerful, and God's answers too many of our petitions this month have allowed us to experience much joy and Grace. This month we did see the hand of God as we reached out to teenagers in various schools. The Lord gave us 2 new schools, raising our population from 37, 838 to 40, 398. We also witnessed 452 soul's submitting to the Lordship of Christ and 343 rededicated their lives to Christ. We also gave out 24 Bibles and over 310 copies of discipleship materials.

Discipleship.

We are not just about leading people to Christ, but we're a team that builds, roots and develop young people who are ready to be presented before Christ, mature and perfect. This past month we have disciple 2002 students across 18 (including the new schools) and we're trusting God to initiate discipleship programs in some other schools' next term.

Testimony.

There's nothing so sad like to be rejected by your mother and teacher. The girl pictured was rejected by her mother who never believed in her, she only saw a burden in her and on the other side her teacher saw her a failure who never deserved to sit in her class and even started calling her names. When we first went to her school, she came to us after the sermon presentation and shared with us what she was going through, the Lord used us in helping her regain her passion and the desire to study and to believe that it's

only God who has the final say in her life. After months of counselling the girl today is strong and can stand before her fellow students to encourage and to remind them of how faithful our God is.



Upcoming goals.

We're trusting God for more schools in Nyahururu and Kisumu at least five or four, and we've already contacted some schools in these regions. We're also praying and trusting God to have training for the volunteers and the Christian union patrons in Kisumu and Nyahururu.
