TURKANA MISSION REPORT 2023.

Introduction.

It is a scorching hot morning in Turkana County, northern Kenya. The ground is dry and sandy, punctuated with small gorse bushes and occasional trees. Tall, thin termite nests point like fingers at the cloudless sky. It seems barely habitable, but people survive here, herding hardy animals like camels and goats, and moving around in search of pasture. The Turkana people are tall and striking. In rural areas, they still wear traditional clothing – beautifully coloured and patterned 'leso' wraps.

We got into Katilu village, feeling ready and charged for the Mission God had given us...the place was so dry and dusty, a clear indication that it had not rained for a very long time...

Esther Atabo, a resident of Katilu said for decades they have never experienced such a drought that has forced them to depend on relief food for survival.

"We are starving because of the drought. We are even going for days before getting something to eat. Our children are the most affected by this biting drought, if we don't get enough food and water on time, we will all perish," she said.

For the last three years we have not received rains, the situation is worsening. Our livestock that we depend on to support our livelihoods are dying. He urged the government and humanitarian agencies to provide the necessary support to the affected families. Our key mission to the people of Katilu village was to share the Gospel of Christ and also to offer food as the Lord had provided...we started off by moving from door to door doing evangelism and one thing that struck our heart's is how receptive this people were to the Gospel of Christ, some of those people that gave their lives to Christ were ready and they willingly gave up tobacco and as a way of commitment they allowed us to burn their tobacco and even some others charms that they had. 32 people gave their lives to Christ and around 73 rededicated their lives back to God during our stay in Katilu.

With the help of God, we managed to feed over 180 people from two different communities during our stay there. We had to cross the River Turkwel on foot to reach out to the people in the other community. Seeing us cross the river together with them brought a great joy and motivation to them that they even slaughtered a goat for us. Families that received food and the Gospel from us appreciated the effort by Youth Impact for the food donation.

Challenges.

- 1. There are no schools around that area, we saw so many kids who are not going to school and because there is no school, the best they know is to go out in search of pasture for their goats. This has also led to language barrier.
- 2. Early marriages for young girl's, during our Mission we met quite a number of young girls who were forced into early marriages because of poverty, thankfully we managed to rescue two of them with the help of the local Pastor.
- 3. Water. Turkana is an extremely dry landscape and sources of drinkable fresh water are scarce. We therefore pray that God will in a very special way provide boreholes for them.

Prayer Points.

- Pray and thank God for those that gave their lives to Christ during the Mission.
- Thank God for the good health we experienced in Turkana and for allowing us cross river Turkwel safely without meeting the crocodile's or snakes in the water.
- Thank God for the provision of food to the people Turkana.
- Thank God for those that gave towards this course and made it possible.

Once again, we're so grateful for your partnership in prayer and donations towards the success of our Mission in Turkana...the need and the struggle is real in Turkana and we would like to request you to continue praying for them and the Mission that is before us in April.
